The Arts Award forms an important component of what is offered to our pupils at Chamberlayne College for the Arts. There are currently over thirty pupils working on the challenge and twenty nine have recently passed the Bronze Level moderation – 100% Pass Rate!!!!

The Arts Award is run entirely outside of the normal curriculum and is supported in the following ways;

- ↻ A weekly club attended by several candidates to work on projects, share results and develop drafts for each component.
- ↻ Film making opportunities which focus on whole school priorities such as Chamberlayne Grit and Literacy.
- ↻ Close Arts Award Adviser support is available at all times to provide clarity of focus and to suggest possible challenges.
- ↻ Wide ranging Arts opportunities which are open to all – events, competitions, clubs, visits and performances.
- ↻ Teachers, Tutees, Heads of Year and the Headteacher, Ewan Scott, all play a role in acknowledging the hard work of candidates.
